Winners finally get their reward

inners of the NFU's 2020 Farmvention Competition have finally been rewarded for their efforts. Selside Endowed Church of England School in Kendal were one of eight winning schools who had entered the competition which challenges primary school children to design one of three farming-related products using Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths skills (STEM).

This year the challenges were:

- Wool the wonder fabric: Design a unique clothing product using British wool.
- Street food superstars: Design a healthy street food dish which celebrates a British ingredient.
- Farm machine 2040: Design a farming machine for the year 2040. The children from Selside in Cumbria

stood out in the street food superstars category with their British Sausage Roll.

The children were meant to be showcasing their designs at an exhibition at the House of Commons on 17 March, but sadly Covid-19 restrictions prevented that from happening.

Thankfully though, on Friday 25 June, they did enjoy a visit from the NFU Discovery Barn for the whole school. NFU President Minette Batters said: "The enthusiasm we've seen from both pupils and teachers is infectious and is reflected in the incredible designs that have been submitted."
