# Homework and Reading at home

This year we would like to improve our communication with parents. In the past we have used Seesaw for our younger children and Google Classroom for our older children. We have decided this year that everyone will use SeeSaw.

There is even a new messenger feature to contact your child's class teacher and a family App so you can see more than one sibling at a time. This is the way teachers will send out weekly homework. Teachers will be in contact with you shortly with your login details.

We are having a big push on reading. We ask that parents read with their child at least 3 times a week and please log it in your child's reading record with a signature. If you have time you could strive for 5 times a week.

'Children who are good at reading do more of it: they learn more, about all sorts of things, and their expanded vocabulary, gained from their reading, increases their ease of access to more reading. Conversely, those for whom reading is difficult fall behind, not just in their reading but in all subjects and a vicious circle develops.

Here's how many words kids would have heard by the time they were 5 years old:

- Never read to, 4,662 words
- 1–2 times per week, 63,570 words
- 3–5 times per week, 169,520 words
- daily, 296,660 words; and five books a day, 1,483,300 words

## Attendance

Any absence from school should be avoided unless for medical reasons, as it can have a serious effect on your child's educational progress. Changes to legislation have removed the discretionary 10 day period of absence which covered family holidays. Schools can only grant requests for a leave of absence in term time in very exceptional circumstances. Our registers will now be audited every half

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term by the council and the Local Authority will look at unauthorised holidays and as a result they will likely get a fine imposed.

## The death of her Majesty the Queen

All the staff were sadden to hear about the death of our Queen. In our reflection area, the children have been sharing messages about what the Queen meant to them. In this national period of mourning, school will remain open as normal except on **Monday the 19<sup>th</sup> of September** which we are now closed for her funeral to take place.



#### PE and outdoor learning kit

This year PE will be on a Wednesday with Mrs Jones. PE bags for the Explorers and Discoverers need to be brought into school on a Monday morning and these will be sent home on a Friday. This will allow us to fit in some mile a day sessions. The Adventurers can leave their PE bags in school and they will be sent home at the end of the half term. PE kits should include; a white plain t'shirt, black plain shorts or jogging bottoms, school hoodie white socks and a pair of trainers.

Over the summer, the school has ordered a new PE hoodie for each child. These need to be in their PE kits every week because you never know what the weather will be like in Selside! We didn't want to introduce something new and force costs onto parents so we have paid for them on this occassion. In the future, the hoodies will also be available from the One Identitiy uniform shop.

Please make sure their waterproofs, wellingtons and other suitable clothing are in school for outdoor learning sessions. The children do have labelled outdoor learning bags in school. These will be sent home at the end of a half term.

## Water bottle and Snacks

Children need to bring in a water bottle to be put on the side, so the children can have a drink throughout the day. These can be taken home daily or left for the week. They all will be sent home on a Friday.

The Explorers and Discoverers are encouraged to bring in a healthy snack for the morning, (no sweets or chocolates please). The Adventurers receive free fruit and milk.
